Refuse and Recycling Collections Over Christmas and the New Year

During the Christmas and New Year period, the day for your food waste and recycling collections will change. This will mean that: -

Your Grey refuse bin, Blue recycling bin, Green bin and Food caddy will be emptied on Monday 23rd December as normal.

Your Food caddy will be emptied on Tuesday 31st December 2024

Your Food caddy and Blue recycling bin will be emptied on

Tuesday 7th January 2025.

Please ensure that your bins are presented at the edge of your property by 6am on your amended collection day.

Green bin collections suspension

Green bin collections will be suspended over the Christmas and New Year period, to allow crews to prioritise the additional recycling and food waste that accrues. There will be no garden waste collections from Friday 27 December 2024 to Wednesday 8 January 2025.

The last Green bin collection for 2024 will be on Monday 23rd December and the first for 2025 will be Monday 20th January

Recycling wrapping paper and Christmas cards

Recycle wrapping paper and Christmas cards with your cardboard in your blue bin. You cannot recycle foil wrapping paper, glittery wrapping paper, glittery cards, ribbons, bows and tape.

What to do with extra recycling over Christmas?

Put extra recycling in a sturdy container or red box and place beside your blue bin. Please flatten or cut large cardboard into pieces no larger than 1m x 1m.

We are not able to collect any side waste from your grey bin or food caddy. Please ensure that all such waste is inside your bin.

Christmas tree recycling

Green bin collections resume in Baginton from Monday 20th January 2025 when real Christmas trees will be collected, and you don't need to have a green bin permit subscription to have yours picked up. Please ensure that all lights, decorations, tree stands, pots and netting are removed. Any tree that is over 5ft tall must be cut in half.

Leave your tree outside in a place that's not obstructing the highway, and they'll collect it for you.

If you're subscribed to the green bin service, you can chop it up and put it in your bin.

Alternatively, you could arrange a collection to support charity. This year JustHelping are supporting The Myton Hospice and Pass The Smile by offering a real Christmas tree collection and recycling service from your doorstep for a small donation. Collections take place $10^{th} - 12^{th}$ January 2025. For more information or to book your collection simply visit www.just-helping.org.uk/register-tree and register your tree before registration closes at midnight on Monday 6^{th} January 2025.



What NOT to Put in Your Blue Bin!

Sherbourne Resource Park, the state-of-the-art recycling facility used by Warwick District Council, has been publishing some top tips during November.

Lots of people recycle correctly, but unfortunately contaminations still find their way into recycling bins. To help, they've been highlighting some common contamination items that people mistakenly include in their recycling bins, and explaining why these items are an issue.

By the time the Newsletter went to print, the top four contaminants had been published: -

- 1. **Vapes** are probably the most dangerous item we encounter when processing recycling, and are far too common. Even those with a hard plastic shell are NOT recyclable. Their lithium-ion batteries can cause substantial fires that are hard to tackle, and pose a danger to staff. Vapes should be disposed of in allocated bins at collection points, including your local recycling centre.
- 2. **Textiles** are not collected as part of kerbside recycling, yet old jumpers, trainers, slippers, and even curtains make their way into recycling bins regularly. These items can cause blockages during processing and even render recyclable items unsalvageable. Instead, these items can be placed in a bag next to your bin, where they will be recycled separately.
- 3. **Nappies** are not recyclable. While there may be some elements of paper or plastic in them, there are some other elements in nappies that are certainly not recyclable! In fact, nappies in recycling leak, spill, and contaminate actual recyclable items causing none of the materials to be reused. Nappies should be put in your grey bin.
- 4. **Cookware** is recyclable, just not in your kerbside bin. Pots, pans, woks, baking trays can be reused if disposed of correctly. These items should be taken to your local household waste recycling centre.

Reporting Car Racing On-Line

If you see or hear cars racing on Baginton roads, it's a crime in progress and Police say that you should call 999.

However, if you can't report it at the time, you should report it online later, even if it's the next day.

The Police online reporting tool can be found at www.warwickshire.police.uk

Some residents have complained that the online form can be confusing. Having contacted the Police, their advice on using the online form is: -

If you see cars racing

Having looked at the online reporting tool, selecting report a 'road traffic incident' would be the appropriate option for reporting dangerous driving (speeding, racing etc) where the incident has been witnessed and details and/or digital evidence can be provided. This would enable us to take any necessary action e.g. issuing a notice of intended prosecution/taking someone to court.

If you hear cars racing

If reporting online without having witnessed an incident such as vehicle antisocial behaviour (ASB) and person(s) are unable to provide details/ evidence, I would advise residents to select the ASB option. This way it can be recorded.

REMEMBER – The more reports of incidents the Police get from residents, the better chance that something will be done.

Police Advice on Driving in Fog

Remember that Fog makes things wet & slippery too.

In the day use dipped headlights, not sidelights.

Only use fog lights when visibility is reduced below 100 metres.

Rear fog lights are bright and can mask your brake lights.

Beware of vehicles with no lights on.

Beware of cyclists with no lights.

Brake slowly and indicate well in advance.

Don't speed, dazzle other drivers or brake hard.

Police Advice on General Winter Travel

A low sun and road glare can dazzle, so use your sunglasses.

Keep vehicle fluids topped up, especially screen wash.

Wiper blades work efficiently for about 3 years. Replace them?

Please put antifreeze into your cooling system.

Check your tyre tread depth, lights and signal light bulbs regularly.

Keep chocolate, drinks, blankets, warm clothes & a shovel in the car.

Keep your mobile with you & keep it charged.

Don't let the fuel tank fall below half empty.

Police Advice on Burglary Prevention over Christmas

Set timers to switch lights on when it gets dark. Unlit homes suggest nobody is at home.

Lock doors, patios & windows, even when you are at home.

If you have an alarm, set it before you go out & before bed.

Don't leave keys or valuables near windows, doors or letterboxes, where burglars can reach through and steal them.

Lock your garden gates, side entrances, sheds and garage doors.

Don't leave tools in your garden that can be used to break in.
