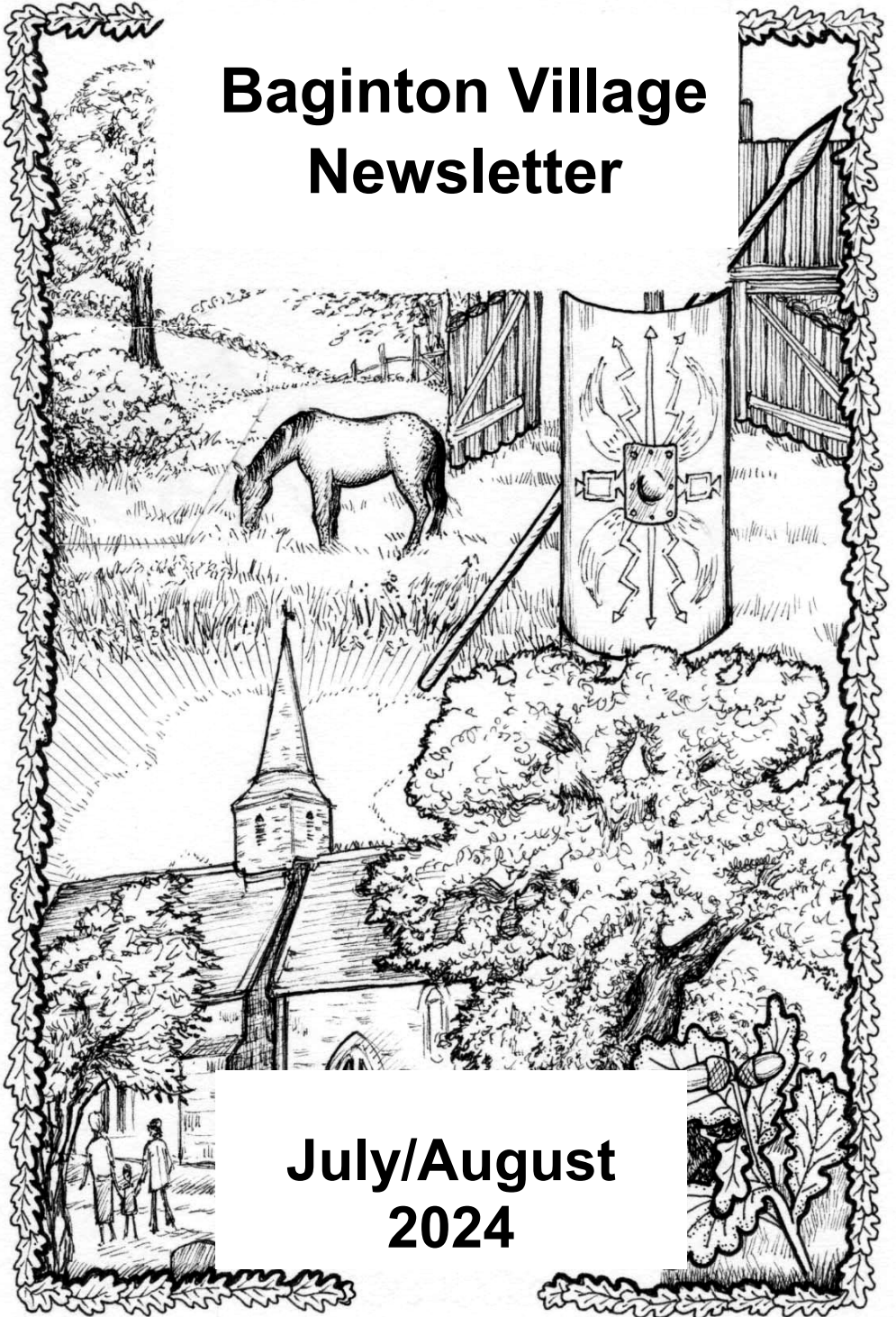

June has been a busy month for our Maintenance Team of volunteers. We received support from Jaguar Landover who organised 3 visits in June (groups of 10+) who were on site from 1000 –1530 hours on each occasion. We are so grateful for their help and they all enjoyed their time with us and worked so hard.

A few of the jobs they helped with were the laying of play bark around the ponds and our Nature Wildlife Walk, the endless task of pulling Himalayan balsam, help in painting the Visitor Centre and general tidying of the site, which at this time of year is never ending.

Repairs were carried out to our Visitor Centre by our dedicated maintenance team who have done an excellent job on the repair.

We also had a visit from Coventry Conservation Volunteers who helped with the pulling of Himalayan balsam.

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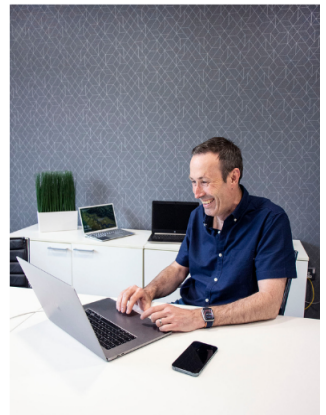


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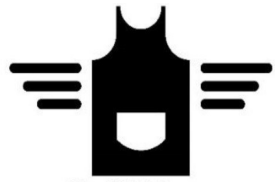

Baginton Gardeners

When writing this, we are still awaiting some summer sunshine! I hope it has arrived by now and you can finally sit down and enjoy the rewards of all your gardening efforts.

However, there are still a few things you can do to maintain the colour in your garden and improve the vegetable produce, which you might do on the duller days!

If we get that hot weather, don't forget that makes thirsty plants as well as thirsty people – we all need to be kept hydrated, hopefully you've invested in a water butt to collect all that rain!

Don't leave your vegetables and soft fruits beyond their prime, this can be a message to the plant to stop producing! Regularly pick ripe tomatoes, courgettes, beans, strawberries and raspberries to encourage further growth on the plant.

Everyone's least favourite job – deadheading! But it has to be done to

encourage the plants to produce more flowers rather than seeds; once this happens its job is done (keep one or two for next year's planting). It also looks much neater and tidier for you when relaxing in the garden.

All the on-going maintenance jobs unfortunately don't go away, weeding, feeding, trimming and mowing the lawn. July is also a great time to sow a second crop of lettuce, spinach, radishes, spring onions, Swiss chard, or sow beetroot for autumn harvest. Have a good summer!

Elayne will be stepping down from Chairing the group from the end of the year. As yet, no-one has shown an interest in ensuring that the group will continue after 2024. If you would like to consider taking over this role, please speak to Elayne soon so that she can work with you to ease you in before hand-over.

I hope you are all well and looking forward to a nice summer, although it has been a bit mixed up until now.

Parish Council Accounts

Following a successful independent internal audit and scrutiny by the Parish Council Finance Committee, the Draft Annual Accounts have now been published on our website at www.baginton-village.org.uk

This year, as neither our income nor our expenditure exceeded £25,000 we have been able to declare ourselves exempt from the Government appointed External Audit.

However, the Period of Public Rights still needs to be followed and runs from 10th June until 19th July.

Lucy Price Playground Fence

The Parish Council has sought grants and donations in order to replace the fence around the Lucy Price Playground with a bow-top metal fence. Despite ongoing repairs, the existing wooden fence that is embedded in the hedge has gaps where a child could exit the Playground onto Coventry Road.

The new fence will be installed inside the existing fence and gaps in the hedge will be replanted when saplings become available. Work will take about 3 days if the weather is good and is due to start the end of July or possibly early August. The Playground will be partly fenced off for safety during the work and we hope residents will be patient with us while the work is completed. If you have any queries, feel free to contact me.

Community Wardens

Warwick District Council (WDC) has appointed 2 new Community Wardens, who are a visible presence across the District, with a focus on hotspots for antisocial behaviour (ASB).

Community Wardens patrol recognised ASB hotspots and where neighbourhood crime has been reported. Appointed by WDC, they have fewer powers than Police, and last month they attended 192 assorted incidents, made 277 patrols, confiscated 4 weapons, enforced 24 public

order restrictions and attended 22 reports of theft. They issued warnings or fines against 3 littering offences, captured 2 stray dogs, helped with 3 missing persons and attended reports of drink spiking, littering, sexual assault, human trafficking, public begging and drug use.

Bring along your own chairs and a picnic or alternatively there will be food available such as burgers from Jimmy's Food, I Love Crepes and a Pig Roast. There will be hot and cold drinks as well as a licensed bar.

Please note that there are no BBQs or firepits allowed, and no dogs are allowed except for assistance dogs.

All vehicles left overnight on the field must be removed between 10am and midday on Sunday 14th July.

BVLR Miniature Railway Open Days

Come and join us at the Bridge View Light Railway to ride on our scenic community miniature railway. We are open between Easter and Halloween, from 12pm until 3pm, as well as special event days. Running days for July are 13th and for August are 4th and 25th.

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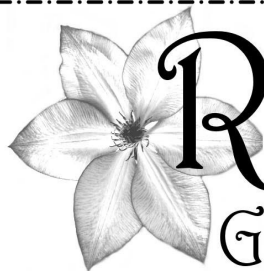
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Baginton Walkers – June 2024

Home Composting in Summer

During the cold winter months compost bins cool down and compost at a much slower rate. In springtime, your compost bin will need a bit of a boost to bring it out of hibernation and begin warming up again. All the creatures that help the material to rot down, such as worms and mites, are still in the compost heap but have moved to the warm centre of the compost bin for the winter.

In the summer, the compost bin will reach temperatures of 70 degrees C and the composting process will speed up dramatically. It's important that the content of greens is kept high with food waste and greenery from the garden, such as grass clippings, to maintain moisture levels and avoid the bin from drying out. There might be compost at the bottom of the bin or heap ready for harvesting. It should be dark brown with a crumbly texture that smells earthy.

The harvested compost can be placed on flower borders or spread on the lawn as a soil conditioner. This is a good method for retaining moisture in the soil. Alternatively, it can be mixed with 1/3 topsoil and 1/3 sharp sand or grit to make a potting mix. Home compost will be too rich to grow seedlings, however, leaf mould is a good starting material for seeds.

Home Compost Bins Offer

Discounted compost bins are available to Warwickshire residents - £18 for a 220 litre and £30 for 330 litre (plus delivery). To buy your bin visit www.getcomposting.com and select Council Offers at the top of the page or phone 0844 5714444.

The 330 litre compost bin is the most common compost bin and a great way to start. It is cheap and effective but will only take uncooked fruit and vegetable waste, mixed with garden waste. It should be placed in a half sunny, half shady area of the garden on bare soil or grass.

Green Johanna - £40 (including delivery)

The Green Johanna is a food digester and, unlike the cold compost bin, can take all food waste including cooked, meat, dairy and fish. It will also compost garden waste. Due to insulated sides, the Green Johanna composts at a higher temperature than the standard cold bin, killing off harmful bacteria that can be found in certain food types such as meat. It should be placed in a shady area of the garden on bare soil or grass.
