

# **Baginton Gardeners**

At our July meeting Elayne shared the news that Sue Burgham would be taking over the role of chair of the group. Elayne would be staying on as a member of the committee, but would be passing on the "Spade" to Sue in the new year.

July's speaker was Lucy Hartley, who returned to give another excellent lecture, this time on "Ecology in the Modern Garden"

Her opening slide quoted Daryl Moore, Oct 2022 "Nurturing a garden is one of the most important things you can do as a person"; as expected all those present agreed. Lucy shared how vital we are as "Keystone animals" in our garden's ecosystem and how the ecosystem's diversity can change with our help.

Lucy explained how we can increase the diversity within our garden by considering what we plant and when it flowers. Such as by planting spring flowering plants with white, yellow or blue flowers we will encourage more spring pollinators into our gardens. We learnt that an Apple tree will support, feed or home 93 different types of life, a Bird's-foot trefoil plant 140 and Garlic mustard 69. Whereas an Oak tree will support over 300, from birds to insects to lichens, which is a complex life form that is a symbiotic partnership of a fungus and an alga.

Lucy talked about her success with leaving nature to control any insect infestations. Predators only reproduce once a year, so if you use pesticides, you risk killing both predator and prey, then being overrun with prey as they reproduce all year round. Although if you allow the prey to build to a level noticed by the predators, they will start and continue to feed on them over the year. If you want predators to be your pest control you need to feed their young. This means having weeds and wildflowers in your garden, many of which are just as beautiful as our traditional flowering plants. You could plant Scarlet Pimpernel with its tiny orange red flowers, or Speedwell with its dainty blue flowers or the yellow flowers of the Nipplewort.

Another experiment Lucy had been working on was her lawn. She delayed mowing some areas until June or even late September, allowing grasses to produce seed heads which along with the unsightly ant hills were a true feast for the birds at the end of summer. By bringing "boarder

plants" into the expanse of her lawn, she created more insect safe havens which again became part of a wider food chain and increased the diversity of her garden.

Lucy then focused on the garden soil, reminding us that even the soil is an ecosystem, full of millions of organisms that are regularly disrupted by digging up weeds. She shared a way to remove weeds (plants in the wrong place) by cutting close to the soil line just under the upper growth of the plant. This method reduces soil damage and seed spreading. With over 30 species of worms in the UK, some consider that "Worms may be more important to the ecosystem and human well-being than bees" (Dave Goulson, The Garden Jungle 2019), so we need to feed the worms too. Don't rake up the leaves - it won't kill the grass; dead matter is good for the garden and good for the worms.

So summing up, Lucy gave us 5 tips to increase the diversity within our gardens ecosystem

- 1. Let some grass grow.
- 2. Don't use pesticides, fertiliser or herbicides.
- 3. Leave dead things about.
- 4. Let wildflowers grow.
- 5. Snip off don't dig up weeds.

Lucy also shared the names of two apps she uses for identification of both plants and wildlife.

iNaturalist and ObsIdentify both help you identify plants and animals while generating data for science and conservation.

# **Lucy Price Playing Field**

You may have observed that a new fence has been erected around the Lucy Price Playing Field (LPPF). It had been noted during the routine park safety inspections that gaps had appeared along the boundary hedge between the LPPF and Coventry Road. The Parish Council duly decided that a fence had to be installed to prevent children running from the park, through the hedge and on to Coventry Road.

The fence selected was a RoSPA approved playground fence and having had three quotes we selected Hawkesbridge Fencing based in Allesley to procure and install it, on the basis they offered the best price and were a local company.

130m of fencing was installed at a cost of just over £17000 and many thanks are due to the organisations that funded the project, namely, SEGRO, Warwickshire County Council, The Gospel Hall and of course the Lucy Price Relief in Need Charity.

By the time you read this, some remedial work on worn paintwork and surfaces will have been completed as well, funded by the Parish Council.

# **Baginton Parish Council**

Dear Residents,

I hope you are all well.

This month's report is short, but relates to topics that have generated comments amongst residents, so I hope it's useful.

#### **Changes to Baginton Bus Services**

From 21<sup>st</sup> July, National Express Coventry (NX Bus) changed the 24 and 25 bus routes, such that no bus from Baginton would stop along the B4113 Leamington Road. This meant that residents couldn't directly access the Doctor's Surgery, Dental Practice, Pharmacy, Post Office and convenience stores in Stivichall or Central Six and Railway Station by bus. This generated a series of complaints to the Parish Council.

In response, the Parish Council made our District and County Councillors aware of how unacceptable this was. We complained directly to NX Bus and to the Warwickshire County Council (WCC) Public Transport portfolio holder.

We have now been assured from the WCC Head of Transport Delivery that from 2<sup>nd</sup> September, some routes will be reinstated to cover stops on the Leamington Road. We have been told:

On reviewing the timetable it has been possible to divert certain journeys via Leamington Road, Stivichall and Coventry Railway Station (or vice-versa) as follows:

Depart Baginton: 07h40, 10h19, 17h19

Depart Coventry Pool Meadow: 06h50, 08h15, 13h05, 16h30, 17h45

This has since been confirmed on the NX Bus Coventry website with the publication of a revised timetable effective from 1<sup>st</sup> September.

#### **UKBIC Update**

Baginton Parish Council continues to meet with UKBIC roughly every 6 months to discuss issues and ongoing works. Our last meeting was on 14<sup>th</sup> August.

Noise formed a large part of our discussions and they are working hard to resolve it. In March / April their main compressor broke down and they realised that their back-up compressor had insufficient acoustic shielding, which has now been resolved. Their main plan is a full 4m

acoustic shielding fence around the entire end of the building where these compressors etc are located. The £0.25 Million is already available, but they are still waiting for permission from WDC to install the fence.

UKBIC are also frustrated as their solar panel array has been ready for some time, which will save significant electricity costs and take strain off the grid around the airport. However, National Grid is not willing to give permission until its 46 week consultation is complete in October.

Finally, they are looking into a dedicated compressor for the IT Suite, so the main compressors can be turned off at night and the smaller IT compressor will keep the main computers etc cool.

Next meeting is due early next year.

#### **Parish Council Accounts**

Right of Public Inspection for the Parish Council 2023/2024 Accounts closed on 19<sup>th</sup> July with no queries raised. The accounts are now signed-off and can be viewed on the Village Website at www.baginton-village.org.uk

#### **Community Orchard**

The weather this year has produced a bumper crop of fruit in the Community Orchard, which is planted with an assortment of cooking and eating apples, pears, plums, damsons and cherries.

Through September and early October, most fruit will ripen for residents to pick for themselves, but we urge you to be considerate and only take what you need so that enough is left for others.

If you are interested in helping to manage the orchard, please let me have your details and I will pass them on.
